The close-up before and after photos can be from any angle; the point of these images is to enable inspection of both the quality of the grafted work as well as the residual scarring in the donor area. The following are examples of before and after close-up photos of the grafted and donor areas to illustrate the type of detail we expect from these photos.

To be clear: We require one close-up view of the grafted area on day of or day after surgery. We require one close-up view of the donor area on day of or day after surgery. These same two close-up views should again be retaken at least 9 months after the day of surgery.

Unlike the other views required which are not close-up, it is helpful to use a comb to reveal the quality of the grafted and harvested areas in these photos.
